A junior Holstein Show will take place during the open classes, sponsored by the Southwest Holstein Club.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURE TIMES

I try to accommodate situations that arise that cause you not to be able to be on time. Please take note of the times to be in place on your scheduled day. There will be no entries accepted after the scheduled day for that breed to arrive, out of fairness to the rest of the exhibitors. REMEMBER, the later you arrive, the more fair traffic and parked cars you will have to maneuver around with your cattle trailer and camper. Campers are free to arrive a few days before the fair begins. You will not be charged for the extra time if you are not using hookups and not staying on site. Please also keep in mind that you can bring cattle in on Thursday, however the parlor will not be running until Friday. All cattle is to stay in place until released by the superintendent. Premium checks will be handed out at 6:00 P.M. on departure day.

ENTRIES

Entries are due by August 10, 2010. A 5.00 entry fee for each individual class is to accompany the entry forms. Mail all entries to Wanda Woods, 1992 Main Street, Castleton, VT 05735. Location in barns will be designated by the Superintendent on arrival of animals. Registration papers do not need to be mailed. Papers will be checked upon entry. Registration papers must accompany all animals.

STALL CLEANLINESS

We have had in recent years, continual problems with some exhibitors leaving for home before cleaning out from under their cattle, old bedding and manure. This is expected of ALL exhibitors! Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of some or all of your premiums from the Fair. This includes exhibitors at the first half of the week as well.

CAMPING FEE

The cost will remain the same as last year, \$8.00/night or \$50.00/week (Saturday night to Saturday night). Pay upon arrival when you check in, or send payment with entries.

4-H ENTRIES

All 4-H entries that are entered in the 4-H Show must abide by all open show rules. There will not be an entry fee for 4-H entries if mailed by August 10 to Wanda Woods.

All 4H members using the milking parlor during the Fair, please keep in mind that we will require adult supervision to accompany you. As always, a stall will be provided for the 4H. Thank you for your cooperation.

All 4-H members are invited to participate in the Bill Weeks Memorial Showmanship contest. However, space providing, if you leave your animal in the open dairy area, you are responsible for the daily care and cleanliness of the animal as well as the area she is housed.

GENERAL RULES

All animals will be shown from the ring, and exhibitors must be ready to bring them out when called, either for judging or parade. Failure to do so entails forfeiture of all premiums.

No one will be allowed in the ring during judging except judges and attendants with animals. The judge may at his discretion require any cow to be milked before him in the ring. For an exhibitor to be eligible to show an animal, the title of ownership of the exhibitor shall show on the registration certificate at the time of the exhibition. Registration papers to be checked for this purpose. The name, age, sex, herd book number, and name and number of sire and dam of each animal must be filed with entry.

RITA TRACEY JR. HERDSMAN TROPHY

The Rita Tracey Jr. Herdsman Trophy will be given to a Junior exhibitor that shows. The basis for this awards will be on neatness and cleanliness of animals, area and sportsmanship during the stay at the fair, in the barn and most important in the ring. Some other areas that come into play is helpfulness to other exhibitors, obeying the show and barn rules, and anyone seen helping the youth of our program. Cattle must be kept clean and in good condition throughout your entire stay with us at the fair.

VERMONT DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE HEALTH REGULATIONS

vermont animals

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI):

All Vermont cattle, sheep, goats, camelids, and swine shall have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued by a veterinarian within six months of the event. Such certificate shall include a description of the animal(s) including sex, breed, age, and any form of individual identification. Such certificate shall also state that the described animals have been inspected and show no signs of infectious, contagious, and/or communicable disease. Such certificate shall also document dates of any required vaccinations or health tests.

Vermont equine animals accompanied by a current negative official EIA test record with a complete identification of the horse and a record of a current rabies vaccination will be acceptable in lieu of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Rabies Vaccination:

All animals over 3 months of age for which there is an approved rabies vaccine, including cattle, horses, sheep, dogs, cats and ferrets, shall have a current rabies vaccination administered according to the manufacturers recommendations. Such vaccination shall be documented either on an individual rabies vaccination certificate or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and shall include the name of the vaccine used, serial number, date administered and its duration. Rabies vaccination of equine can be recorded on an official EIA test record. It is recommended that the vaccination should be administered at least 30 days prior to the event and that it be current within the previous 12 months. Vaccination less than 30 days should be accepted for younger animals not old enough to vaccinate in sufficient time prior to the event.

Animals for which there is no currently approved vaccine, including goats, camelids, swine and wolf hybrids, extra-label administration of rabies vaccine approved for other species by a veterinarian is recommended.

Scabies: Cattle affected with scabies or ringworm shall not be admitted.

OUT-OF-STATE ANIMALS

All imported domestic animals except dogs, cats, and horses require import permits from the Department of Agriculture, Food & Markets. Call 802-828-2421.

All imported domestic animals except dogs, cats, and horses require a certificate of veterinary inspection within 30 days of entering the state.

An exhibition permit which can replace the requirement for an import permit and the certificate of veterinary inspection may be obtained from the Department of Agriculture at 802-828-2421. This

exhibition permit is good for the show season for most animals.

Changes in the import rules allow cattle to enter Vermont from states classified as free from tuberculosis and brucellosis without testing for these diseases.

VERMONT STATE FAIR MANDATE:

Cattle Shipping Fever Vaccination:

All cattle shall have a shipping fever vaccination within 6 months but no less than 14 days prior to the event which includes IBR, BVD, P13, and BRSV. Such vaccination shall be documented on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and shall include the date administered and the trade name of the vaccine.

ANTIBIOTIC TEST

An antibiotic test will be taken from each herd at every milking. If there is a problem with the tank of milk, then the person or persons responsible will be fined for the cost of the antibiotic test and the value of the contaminated milk.
